Volunteer SART Advocates conduct outreach to local police stations & make brief presentations about CPAF's services. They also respond to calls from survivors, law enforcement, &/or forensic nurses to attend exams and interviews. Survivor advocates work at the request of the survivor—providing critical emotional support, advocating for the needs of the survivor, clarifying the process, and giving additional information/resources as needed.

Requirements: LiveScan Background check; TB test; volunteer application and interview; completion of CPAF's 65-hour Advocate Training
